### Findinas

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the staff in charge did not present verification that the employees with the hire dates of 9/8/14, 10/4/19 and 11/4/19 had completed the pediatric abuse head trauma training in accordance with regulatory standards. Review of documentation in the ECE-TRIS training system revealed the staff members listed above had not met the requirements.

### Findings:

General: Based on observation, in the three (3) year old classroom, five (5) year old classroom and pre-k room there were ceiling tiles with stains, indicative of water damage. In the pre-k room there were two (2) tiles above the loft that were not fitted properly in the frame, exposing the ventilation.

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the staff in charge did not present verification that the files for the children with the enrollment dates of 2/26/20, 7/8/20, and 11/18/19 contained an identified preferred hospital.

922 KAR 2:405E. Emergency Regulation.

Due to the current declared public health emergency caused by the Novel Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19), licensed child care centers must operate under Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and public health guidelines, as mandated by 922 KAR 2:405E, to prevent the spread of COVID-19.

# Findings:

General: Based on observation, in the three (3) year old classroom there were four (4) plush toys accessible to the children. Further review in the pre-k classroom revealed a bathtub filled with soft plush toys that were accessible to the children. Therefore, the center failed to assure compliance with the emergency regulations specific the current pandemic regarding machine washable toys.
