(16) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:

(a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;

(b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1 $\frac{1}{2}$) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and

(c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

Findings

410 - Training

General: Based on review of documentation, review of ECE-TRIS, and interview, the following were found:

- 1. A staff file (DOH: 8/15/08) contained documentation that Pediatric Abusive Head Trauma (PAHT) training had been completed last on 3/4/13; therefore, it had not been renewed within five (5) years as required.
- 2. A staff file (DOH: 8/1/07) contained documentation that Pediatric Abusive Head Trauma (PAHT) training had been completed last on 3/4/13; therefore, it had not been renewed within five (5) years as required.
- 3.A staff file (DOH: 8/1/99) contained documentation that Pediatric Abusive Head Trauma (PAHT) training had been completed last on 5/21/13; therefore, it had not been renewed within five (5) years as required.
- 4. A staff file (DOH: 7/1/07) contained documentation that Pediatric Abusive Head Trauma (PAHT) training had been completed last on 5/21/13; therefore, it had not been renewed within five (5) years as required.

Review of ECE-TRIS, revealed that the staff had not renewed PAHT training within five (5) years. The Director stated she was not aware that it needed to be renewed every five (5) years.

- (4) A cold-storage facility used for storage of perishable food in a nonfrozen state shall:
- (a) Have an indicating thermometer or other appropriate temperature measuring device;
- (b) Be in a safe environment for preservation; and
- (c) Be forty (40) degrees Fahrenheit or below.

Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, the thermometor located in the refrigerator where the children's snacks are stored was reading at forty-three (43) degrees Fahrenheit rather than at forty (40) degrees Fahrenheit or less as required. Staff was not aware that the refrigerator was not maintained at the required temperature.

- (1) A child-care center shall maintain:
- (b) A written record for each child:
- 1. Completed and signed by the child's parent;
- 2. Retained on file on the first day the child attends the child-care center; and
- 3. To contain:
- a. Identifying information about the child, which includes, at a minimum, the child's name, address, and date of birth;
- b. Contact information to enable a person in charge to contact the child's:
- (i) Parent at the parent's home or place of employment;
- (ii) Family physician; and
- (iii) Preferred hospital;
- c. The name of each person who is designated in writing to pick-up the child;
- d. The child's general health status and medical history including, if applicable:
- (i) Allergies;
- (ii) Restriction on the child's participation in activities with specific instructions from the child's parent or health professional; and
- (iii) Permission from the parent for third-party professional services in the child-care center;
- e. The name and phone number of each person to be contacted in an emergency involving or impacting the child;
- f. Authorization by the parent for the child-care center to seek emergency medical care for the child in the parent's absence;

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, the surveyor found that a child's file (DOE: 8/28/18) did not contain the name or contact information for the preferred hospital. The Director stated that she was not aware that the information was missing from the file.
