922 KAR 2:090. Section 6. License Issuance.

- (5) An individual described in subsection (4) of this section shall:
- (a) Submit to background checks described in paragraph (b) of this subsection;
- (b) May be employed or work with a child on a probationary basis for up to ninety (90) calendar days, pending completion of a:
- 1. Child abuse or neglect check using the central registry in accordance with 922 KAR 1:470;
- 2. Criminal records check required by KRS 199.896(19);
- 3. Criminal records check for any previous state of residence if the person resided outside the state of Kentucky in the last five (5) years; and
- 4. An address check of the Sex Offender Registry; and
- (c) Not be left alone in the presence of a child until copies of the background checks in accordance with paragraph (b) of this subsection have been received by the licensee.

Findings:

General: Based on Review of Documentation, the surveyor found one (1) staff person hired on 8/31/17 had results of a criminal records check dated 10/17/17. The request for the criminal records check was also dated 10/17/17. The request was not completed prior to hire as required by KRS 199.896(19). The Director acknowledged the deficiency and stated that it was a mistake. She stated that this staff person never worked alone.

325 - CPR/First Aid Coverage Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:110. Section 5. Staff Requirements.

- (3) For a child-care center licensed for infant, toddler, or preschool-age children, at least one (1) person on duty and present with the children shall be currently certified by a cabinet-approved training agency in the following skills:
 - (a) Infant and child cardiopulmonary resuscitation; and
 - (b) Infant and child first aid.
- (4) For a child-care center licensed for school-age children, at least one (1) person on duty and present with the children shall be currently certified by a cabinet-approved training agency in the following skills:
- (a) Adult cardiopulmonary resuscitation; and
- (b) First aid.

Findings:

General: Based on Review of Documentation, three (3) staff files contained CPR and First Aid documentation that had been obtained through an organization called International CPR Institute. The Director stated that the courses were completed online. The surveyor found that of the three (3) staff; one opens the facility at 5:30 a.m. and one is a van driver. It is important to note that file review found the infant staff person certified in CPR and First Aid that had been completed through a cabinet-approved training agency but this staff person does not arrive at the facility until 9:00 a.m. and is not a van driver. The Director stated that she was unaware that online CPR and First Aid classes were unacceptable.

340 - Training Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:110. Section 5. Staff Requirements.

- (14) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:
- (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;
- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of pediatric abusive head trauma training; and
- (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

Findings:

General: Based on Review of Documentation and ECE-TRIS, the surveyor found one (1) staff person had abusive pediatric head trauma training that was completed on 9/15/12; therefore, this person is past the five (5) year renewal mark.

922 KAR 2:120. Section 4. Premises Requirements.

(9) Floors, walls, and ceilings shall be smooth, in good repair, and constructed to be easily cleaned.

Findings:

General: Based on observation in the infant classroom, the surveyor observed numerous staples embedded in the walls and a few areas of peeling wallpaper.

General: Based on Observation, the surveyor observed mulch around the wood climbing structure located on the front playground, but did not observe any mulch around the sliding board.

General: Based on Review of Documentation, two (2) children's files (enrollment date for both-6/13/17) did not have the parent's preferred hospital information listed.
