#### Findings:

General: Based on Observation, interviews, and review of documentation, the child care center failed to comply with staffing requirements. Based on observation on 03/19/15, one staff member was caring for seven (7) infants upon the surveyors arrival into the classroom. Based on interviews, more than five (5) infants are cared for by one staff member. Based on a review of documentation, seven (7) children were signed in on 03/17/15 and 03/19/15. Based on continued review of sign in sheets, six (6) infants attended on 03/16/15, and 03/18/15.

420 - Infant Sleep Position

## 922 KAR 2:120. Section 6. Sleeping and Napping Requirements.

(1) An infant shall sleep or nap on the infant's back unless the infant's health professional signs a waiver that states the infant requires an alternate sleeping position.

#### Findings:

General: Based on Interview, review of documentation, and observation, the child care center failed to comply with regulatory programming requirements. Based on interviews, infants were observed sleeping in swings, activity centers and high chairs. Based on a review of documentation, at least seven (7) infants were enrolled and attending in the infant room on 03/19/15. Based on observation, there were only six (6) cribs in the infant room.

## Food Service

### 910 - Bottle Feeding

- 922 KAR 2:120. Section 3. General Requirements.
- (11) While bottle feeding an infant, the:
- (a) Child shall be held; and
- (b) Bottle shall not be:
- 1. Propped;
- 2. Left in the mouth of a sleeping infant; or
- 3. Heated in a microwave

## Findings:

General: Based on Interview, the child care center failed to maintain the food service in accordance with regulatory requirements. Based on interviews, infants' bottles were propped for feeding when the child was unable to hold the bottle him/her self.

955 - Single Service Item

922 KAR 2:120. Section 8. Kitchen Requirements.
(8) A single-service item shall be:

- (a) Stored;
- (b) Handled and dispensed in a sanitary manner; and
- (c) Used only once.
