- (16) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:
- (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;
- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1 1/2) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and
- (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and onehalf (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulatory requirements. Upon request, the staff in charge did not present verification that three (3) staff members with hire dates of 10/22/12; 12/09/14 and 7/24/18 completed the required fifteen (15) annual hours of cabinet approved early care and education training. Review of an ECE-TRIS report could not verify that the training had been completed and an interview with the staff in charge revealed the cabinet approved training was not done.

922 KAR 2:120. Section 4. Premises Requirements.

- (21) A protective surface shall:
- (a) Be provided for outdoor play equipment used to:
- 1. Climb:
- 2. Swing; and
- 3. Slide; and
- (b) Have a fall zone equal to the height of the equipment.

Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, the child care center failed to maintain an outdoor play area in accordance with regulatory requirements. Observation of the playground area revealed a slide and a set of swings located to the center of the playground area that did not contain a sufficient protective surface underneath the equipment. The area underneath the equipment also had exposed dirt within the ground covering. The staff in charge agreed during interview that the playground area did not contain a sufficient protective surface underneath the equipment.

Findings:

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the child care center failed to maintain children's records in accordance with regulatory requirements. A review of ten (10) children's files revealed there is no Physician listed for two (2) children. Interview with the staff in charge revealed the documentation was not available at the time of the survey.
