(1)(a) A provider shall complete annually at least nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training beginning with the second year of operation, including one and one-half ($1\frac{1}{2}$) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training in accordance with KRS 199.8982(2):

- 1. Within the second year of employment or operation in child care; and
- 2. Every subsequent five (5) years of employment or operation in child care.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation and ECE-TRIS, the surveyor found the following:

- 1. No verification was found that the provider (DOH: 6/9/06) has completed one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training. The provider confirmed through interview that the training was not completed.
- 2. Verification of only one (1) hour of cabinet-approved early care and education training was found for the provider (DOH: 6/9/06) for the review period of 6/9/17 through 6/8/18. The provider confirmed through interview that only one (1) hour of annual training was completed.

922 KAR 2:100 - Section 11. The General Requirements of the Family Child-Care Home Environment.

- (3) The areas of the home that are accessible to children in care shall be free from items harmful to children including the following items:
- (a) Cleaning supplies, poisons, paints, and insecticides;
- (b) Knives, scissors, and sharp objects;
- (c) Power tools, lawn mowers, hand tools, nails, and other equipment;
- (d) Matches, cigarettes, lighters, combustibles, and flammable liquids;
- (e) Plastic bags; and
- (f) Litter and rubbish.

Findings:

General: Based on observation during a tour of the kitchen, the surveyor found that sharp knives were stored in a cabinet drawer. The child latch was not working properly and the drawer easily opened; therefore, the knives were accessible to the children.

General: Based on observation, the surveyor found that prescription medication was stored in the refrigerator. The medication was not in a locked and secured area.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation during the annual inspection conducted on 3/29/18, the surveyor found that the provider's liability insurance was no longer current as of 2/23/19. An updated insurance policy was not available for review per the provider.

922 KAR 2:100 - Section 11. The General Requirements of the Family Child-Care Home Environment. (18) A fire drill shall be conducted during hours of operation:

(a) At least monthly; and

(b) Documented.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, the surveyor found written verification that a fire drill was practiced during January 2018. No written verification was found that additional fire drills were practiced during 2018 and none for January or February 2019. The provider confirmed through interview that the drills were not conducted.

770 - Earthquake Drill and Tornado Drill Requirements

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, the surveyor found no written verification that earthquake and tornado drills were conducted for the second, third and fourth quarters of 2018. The provider confirmed through interview that the drills were not conducted.

775 - Attendance Records Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:100 - Section 18, Records.

- (1) A provider shall maintain:
- (c) Daily attendance records documenting the arrival and departure time of each child, including records that are required in accordance with
- 922 KAR 2:160, Section 13 if a child receives services from the provider through the Child Care Assistance Program;

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the surveyor found that on 3/29/19, four (4) children were in attendance at the childcare center. Review of the Daily Attendance Record found that the arrival time was recorded for only one (1) of the children.

795 - Evacuation Plan Records

General: Based on review of documentation, the surveyor found no written verification that the emergency preparedness plan was reviewed for revised during 2018. The provider stated during interview that the plan was not reviewed during this period.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, the surveyor found that a dog's rabies vaccination was dated 2017. Therefore, the rabies vaccination was not current. The provider stated during interview that the children have infrequent access to the pet and she was unaware the vaccination had expired.
