A staff, hired on 09/21/09, had a written annual performance evaluation on file that was dated 09/01/15. A staff, hired on 02/25/15, had a written annual performance evaluation on file that was dated 02/16. A staff, hired on 09/15/14, had a written annual performance evaluation on file that was dated 02/16. A staff, hired on 09/15/14, had a written annual performance evaluation on file that was dated 20/15. A staff, hired on 09/08/16, did not have a written annual performance evaluation on file.

922 KAR 2:110. Section 5. Staff Requirements.

- (14) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:
- (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;
- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1 $\frac{1}{2}$) hours of pediatric abusive head trauma training; and
- (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

Findings

General: Based on Review of Documentation, a staff, hired on 03/08/10, completed seven (7) hours of cabinet approved training during the subsequent year of employment. A staff, hired on 06/01/06, and a staff, hired on 02/25/15, each completed twelve (12) hours of cabinet approved training during the subsequent year of employment. A staff, hired on 06/16/14, did not complete any cabinet approved training hours during the subsequent year of employment. A staff, hired on 04/04/16, each completed six (6) hours of cabinet approved orientation training on 09/17/16, which was not within the first three (3) months of employment.

922 KAR 2:120. Section 3. General Requirements.

- (7) Except in accordance with subsection (8) of this section, the following shall be inaccessible to a child in care:
- (a) Toxic cleaning supplies, poisons, and insecticides;
- (b) Knives and sharp objects;
- (c) Matches, cigarettes, lighters, and flammable liquids;
- (d) Plastic bags;
- (e) Litter and rubbish;
- (f) Bar soap; and
- (g) Personal belongings and medications of staff.

Findings:

General: Based on Observation, two (2) large rolls of plastic garbage bags were stored in an unlocked cabinet under the sink in the infants' room. A caregiver's purse hung on the wall, a caregiver's cell phone was on top of a storage bin on the counter, and wadded up plastic bags inside of a plastic bag were stored on the bottom shelf of an unlocked cabinet in the three-year-olds' room. A plastic bag full of wadded up plastic bags was stored on the bottom shelf in an unlocked cabinet in the two-year-olds' room. All of these items were accessible to children.

Findings:

General: Based on Observation, an accumulation of dust was on the air vent in the pre-K restroom.

- 2. Adequately heated;
- 3. Ventilated; and

Findings:

General: Based on Observation, dead bugs were inside two (2) light shields in the three-year-olds' room. Dead bugs were inside a light shield in the pre-K restroom.

- (6) Medication, including refrigerated medication, shall be:
- (a) Stored in a separate and locked place, out of the reach of a child;
- (b) Kept in the original bottle; and
- (c) Properly labeled.
- (7) Medication shall not be given to a child if the expiration date on the bottle has passed.

Findings:

General: Based on Observation, a two (2) ounce tube of Desitin diaper rash cream was not labeled to indicate to whom it belonged in the infants' room. A two (2) ounce tube of Desitin diaper rash cream, and A and D diaper rash ointment, were each stored in an unlocked cabinet under the diapering station in the infants' room. A three (3) ounce tube of A and D diaper rash ointment was not labeled to indicate for whom it was intended; a three ounce tube of A and D diaper rash ointment and a two (2) ounce tube of Desitin diaper rash cream were stored in an unlocked compartment under the sink in the one-year-olds' room. A three (3) ounce tube of Baby Anti-Monkey Butt diaper rash cream was not labeled to indicate to whom it belonged and was stored in an unlocked cabinet in the older one-year-olds' room. A six (6) ounce tube of Desitin diaper rash cream was stored in an unlocked cabinet above the sink in the two-year-olds' room. A bottle of Advil liquid gel and a bottle of DG Health sore throat and cough lozenges were not labeled to indicate for whom each was intended and both were stored in an unlocked cabinet in the two-year-olds' room.

Findings:

General: Based on Observation, a crib mattress was torn in the infants' room.

760 - Indoor/Outdoor Equipment

- 922 KAR 2:120. Section 11. Toys and Furnishings.
- (2) Indoor and outdoor equipment shall:
- (a) Be clean, safe, and in good repair;
- (b) Meet the physical, developmental needs, and interests of children of different age groups;
- (c) Be free from sharp points or corners, splinters, protruding nails or bolts, loose or rusty parts, hazardous small parts, lead-based paint, poisonous material, and flaking or chalking paint; and
- (d) Be designed to guard against entrapment or situations that may cause strangulation.

Findings:

General: Based on Observation, safety belts were missing from two (2) highchairs in the one-year-olds' room. The warning label on each highchair indicated to, "always secure children in restraint." A steering wheel was missing from a Little Tikes airplane, purple car and police car on the outdoor playground. In addition, the tires were folded inward on a Little Tikes purple car on the outdoor playground. An inch thick mattress was used in a Delta crib in the one-year-olds' room. The manufacturer recommended a two (2) inch thick mattress be used in the crib.

Findings:

General: Based on Review of Documentation, the date, time and name of children participants were not documented for a fire drill that was conducted in December 2016.

1140 - Fire Drills Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 3. General Requirements.

- (12) A fire drill shall be conducted during hours of operation:
- (a) At least monthly; and
- (b) Documented.

Findings:

General: Based on Review of Documentation, a fire drill was not documented in December 2016. Interview determined the drill was conducted but was not documented.

1145 - Earthquake/Tornado Drills
