Upon request, the child care center director failed to provide evidence of fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment for staff members with hire dates 08/20/14 and 08/28/15.

(c) Space for the toddler is available in the preschool-age group;

(d) The staff-to-child ratios and group sizes are maintained based on the age of the youngest child;

(e) The center has a procedure for listing a transitioning toddler on attendance records, including a specific day and time the toddler is with

either age group; and

(f) The child care center has obtained the signature and approval of the toddler's parent on the toddler's transition plan.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, interview and review of documentation, the child care center failed to comply with regulatory programming requirements. Observation of the Two's Classroom revealed nine (9) children and two (2) staff. The children in the classroom were combined throughout the inspection from 9:37 AM to 1:50 PM. Interview with staff revealed the youngest child in the classroom was two-years-old and the oldest was three-years-old; therefore, toddlers were combined with older children.
