- b. Within thirty (30) minutes of arrival for school-age children;
- 2. Before and after eating or handling food;
- 3. After toileting or diaper change;
- 4. After handling animals;
- 5. After touching an item or an area of the body soiled with body fluids or wastes; and
- 6. After outdoor or indoor play time; and
- (c) Use hand sanitizer or hand-sanitizing wipes if liquid soap and warm running water are not available in accordance with paragraph (b) of this subsection. The child shall wash the child's hands as soon as practicable once liquid soap and warm running water are available.

Findings:

General: Based on observation of the one-year-old room a staff member did not wash the children's hands before lunch.

685 - Diaper Changing Area/Surface

Findings:

General: Based on observation of a changing pad located in the restroom off the two-year-old room revealed a build up of dirt and debris.

General: Based on observation of the outdoor play area the green gate drags on the sidewalk when opening. Continued observation revealed the gate would not close.

(28) A child-care center shall have enough toys, play apparatus, and developmentally appropriate materials to provide each child with a variety of activities during the day, as specified in Section 2 of this administrative regulation.

Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, of the two-year-old room, there was not an adequate amount of developmental materials and toys for the children to play with. There were five (5) fabric toy cars, one (1) plastic green ball, and two (2) fabric story books. There were six children present in the room at the time of the observation. Further observation, revealed in the same room was an area the was sectioned off with a gate and divider that led to a space with large plastic blocks, age appropriate story books, cars, dolls, balls and manipulatives that were age appropriate for the children. Interview with the staff member revealed that she gets the toys out through out the day and puts them back in the gated area where the childen can not gain access of the matrials. Interview with the staff in charge is aware of this concern and has coached the staff member in regards to this concern.

790 - Crib/Mattress/Sheet Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 6. Sleeping and Napping Requirements.

- (3) Rest time shall include adequate space specified by the child's age as follows:
- (a) For an infant:
- 1. An individual non-tiered crib that meets Consumer Product Safety Commission standards established in 16 C.F.R. 1219-1220;
- 2. A firm crib mattress in good repair with a clean tight-fitted sheet that shall be changed:
- a. Weekly; or
- b. Immediately if it is soiled or wet;

Findings:

General: Based on observation of the infant room it was revealed four (4) of the five (5) cribs did not have a manufactures date. Upon request the staff in charge failed to provide the documentation to verify the cribs compliant with the federal safety standards. Continued observation in the infant room revealed a crib was being used to store a bouncy seat and exersaucer. Interview with the staff member did not verify that the sheets were changed before placing an infant in the crib.

800 - Twelve Inch Spacing Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 6. Sleeping and Napping Requirements.

(6) Cots, equipment, and furnishings used for sleeping and napping shall be spaced twelve (12) inches apart to allow free and safe movement by a person.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, of the two-year-old room there were two (2) rest mats that were not twelve (12) inches apart.
