General: Based on review of documentation and interview, the child care center director failed to assure compliance with regulatory requirements. Review of documentation revealed that documentation to verify that staff meetings had been conducted was not presented for review. Upon request, the director did not present documentation to verify that staff meetings had been conducted at the time of the survey.

## 350 - Health, Safety, Comfort

922 KAR 2:090. Section 10. Director Requirements and Responsibilities.
(1) A director shall:
(I) Assure the health, safety, and comfort of each child;

## Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center director failed to assure compliance with regulatory requirements. There was a plunger located next to the toilet in the bathroom in the Preschool Room. There was a plastic "dollar general" bag containing a toilet bowl brush hanging from a metal rack above the toilet in the Two-Year-Old Room.

1. A statement from a health professional that the individual is free of active tuberculosis; or

### Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulatory requirements. Review of the presented employee records revealed files for staff members with hire dates 12/16/17 and 2/19/18 did not contain a statement from a health professional that the staff member is free of active tuberculosis. Upon request, the director did not present a current statement for the employees at the time of the survey.

### 410 - Training

## 922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

(16) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following: (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;

(b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½)

## hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and

(c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and onehalf (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

#### Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulatory requirements. Review of the presented employee records revealed a staff member's file with hire date 2/27/17 that did not contain documentation to verify completion of the fifteen (15) hours of cabinet approved training. Review of ECE-TRIS verified that the staff member did not complete the fifteen (15) hours of cabinet approved training. Upon request, the director did not present documentation for the staff member's file with hire date 1/31/17 that did not contain documentation to verify completion of the survey. Continued review of the presented employee records revealed a staff member's file with hire date 1/31/17 that did not contain documentation to verify completion of the one and one-half (1 ½) hours of pediatric abusive head trauma within the first year of employment.

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain the premises in accordance with regulatory requirements. There was a clear bottle labeled "disinfectant spray" located on the counter next to the changing table in the One-Year-Old Room. There were three (3) clear plastic bottles labeled "disinfectant spray" hanging from the metal rack by the toilet within reach of the children in care in the Preschool Room #2.

(a) Stored in a separate and locked place, out of the reach of a child unless the medication is:

1. A first aid supply and is maintained in accordance with subsection (1) of this section;

2. Diaper cream, sunscreen, or toothpaste. Diaper cream, sunscreen, or toothpaste shall be inaccessible to a child;

3. An epinephrine auto-injector. In accordance with KRS 199.8951:

a. An epinephrine auto-injector shall be inaccessible to a child;

b. A child-care center shall have at least one person onsite who has received training on the administration of an epinephrine auto-injector if the child-care center maintains an epinephrine auto-injector;

c. A child-care center shall seek emergency medical care for a child if an auto-injector is administered to the child; and

d. A child-care center shall report to the child's parent and the cabinet in accordance with 922 KAR 2:090, Section 12 if an epinephrine autoinjector is administered to a child: or

4. An emergency or rescue medication for a child in care, such as medication to respond to diabetic or asthmatic condition, as prescribed by the child's physician. Emergency or rescue medication shall be inaccessible to a child in care;

(b) Kept in the original bottle; and

(c) Properly labeled.

(7) Medication shall not be given to a child if the medication's expiration date has passed.

#### Findings:

730 - Medication

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to comply with the regulatory requirements regarding first aid/or medication. There was a tube of butt cream located in the lower level of the cubbies within reach of the children in care in the Infant Room. There was a tube of butt cream and a prescription box of butt cream located on the lower levels of the cubbies within reach of the children in care in the One-Year-Old Room. There was a bottle of sunscreen within reach of the children located on the counter above the sinks in the Preschool Room #2.

(b) Free of peeling, flaking, or chalking paint.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain equipment in accordance with regulatory requirements. The corner of the blue plastic top of the wooden table located in the Preschool Room was cracked. The blue, red and green pillows located in the One-Year-Old Room were soiled and stained. The door was broken off the black toaster oven located in the dramatic play area in the Two-Year-Old.

#### 820 - Indoor/Outdoor Equipment

922 KAR 2:120. Section 11. Toys and Furnishings.

(2) Indoor and outdoor equipment shall:

(a) Be clean, safe, and in good repair;

(b) Meet the physical, developmental needs, and interests of children of different age groups;

(c) Be free from sharp points or corners, splinters, protruding nails or bolts, loose or rusty parts, hazardous small parts, lead-based paint,

poisonous material, and flaking or chalking paint; and

### (d) Be designed to guard against entrapment or situations that may cause strangulation.

### Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain equipment in accordance with regulatory requirements. There were several cracked pieces of wood located at the top of the steps of the spiral sliding play set on the outside play area.
