922 KAR 2:400E. Emergency Regulation.

Due to the current declared public health emergency caused by the Novel Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19), licensed child care centers must operate under Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and public health guidelines, as mandated by 922 KAR 2:400E, to prevent the spread of COVID-19.

Findings:

General: Based on review of 922KAR2:400E. Enhanced requirements for certified and licensed child care as a result of a declared state of emergency. Section 8, Training Requirements. (1) All child care staff, directors, owners, and operators shall complete a new, mandatory training on cleaning, sanitizing, health procedures, and mandatory reporting prior to the date of reopening. The center failed to meet the enhanced safety requirements as evidenced by a caregiver hired 02/07/18, and a caregiver hired 02/13/14, did not have documentation of completing the mandatory training prior to the center reopening.
