#### Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, twenty-eight (28) preschool children sat on the floor and did not wash their hands prior to eating morning snack. Fourteen (14) preschool children did not wash their hands after morning snack. Twelve (12) preshool children did not wash their hands after they returned from indoor play in the gym.
