- 1. There were two open windows in the Orange classroom. The windows did not have screens or any barrier to the outdoors.

  2. There were two open windows in the Yellow classroom. The screens in the windows did not properly fit the opening, leaving a two-inch gap at the top of the opening.
- 3. The door to the playground was propped open for approximately 30 minutes. There was no screen or barrier to the outdoors.
