Findings:

General: Based on Interview and observation, the child care center director failed to assure compliance with regulatory requirements. The location of a first aid kit was unknown to all four (4) staff members present at the time of the survey when requested for review. An individual identified as staff in charge, stated she "had no clue, I have no idea" when asked what she would do if a child was injured that day, continuing in stating she was not an employee, but was just there to "help out for the day". Observation in the infant room revealed the aforementioned staff member to remain on a cell phone while infants were crying without attention to their needs. Additionally, when asked for information regarding the child care program, the staff member did not discontinue her cell phone usage and stated she was not an employee, "just someone helping out for the day". A covered electrical outlet was approximately three (3) inches outside of the perimeter of an infants crib, allowing accessibility to the cover and the outlet. An additional electrical outlet was observed to be uncovered/unprotected in the entryway into the building.

General: Based on Review of Documentation, the child care center director failed to assure compliance with regulatory requirements. All three (3) of the active classrooms surveyed were observed to be supervised by one (1) sole staff member from approximately 10:00 A.M. to 2:00 P.M. All staff files were unavailable for review as the present staff members failed to possess a key to unlock the file cabinet, where the staff files were stored.

General: Based on Review of Documentation, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulatory requirements. Staff files were unavailable for review when requested. In a phone interview with the owner during the survey, she (the owner)stated that the staff files were locked in a file cabinet inaccessible at the time of the survey. A phone interview revealed staff members with hire dates of: 11/14/16, 03/29/17, 03/31/17, 04/05/17, 03/31/17, 02/21/07, 01/30/17, 11/28/16, and 05/08/15. Background checks were unavailable on all staff members identified. Staff members observed working alone had hire dates of: 04/05/17, 11/14/16, 11/28/16, and 03/31/17.

General: Based on Review of Documentation and interview, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulatory requirements. Files for staff members with hire dates of: 11/14/16, 03/29/17, 03/31/17, 04/05/17, 03/31/17, 02/21/07, 01/30/17 11/28/16, and 05/08/15 could not be accessed at the time of the survey as the cabinet that contained the files was locked and staff members did not have the key to access the files when requested. Interview with staff in charge revealed she did not have the key to unlock the file cabinet and the owner was out of town.
