(n) Assure that a person acting as a caregiver of a child in care shall not be left alone with a child, if the licensee has not received the results of the background checks as described in 922 KAR 2:280;

Findings:

General: Based on observation and review of documentation, the child-care center director failed to process background checks for staff through the National Background Check Portal prior to leaving staff alone to care for children. Based on file review and a review of the Kentucky National Background Check Service (KARES) the surveyor found the director and five (5) staff have yet to complete background checks through the National Background Check Portal. The director stated the public school system processed their background checks; however, the surveyor found the background checks presented for review had been processed through the Kentucky State Police. Four (4) staff hired on 11/5/18, 8/22/17, 1/5/16, 8/16/08) were observed working with children during the renewal inspection.

General: Based on review of documentation, a staff person hired on 8/16/08 had TB documentation on file that was no longer valid as of 11/5/18. Additionally, the director hired on 7/1/12 had TB documentation on file that was no longer current as of 4/4/19.

(16) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following: (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;

(b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1 1/2) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and

General: Based on review of documentation and ECE-TRIS the surveyor found the following:

1. A staff person hired on 1/5/16 completed twelve (12) hours of early care and education training.

2. A staff person hired on 8/16/08 completed five (5) hours of early care and education training.

3. A staff person hired on 8/22/17 completed 13.5 hours of early care and education training.

4. A staff person hired on 8/16/17 completed six (6) hours of early care and education training.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, interview and review of documentation, the child-care center failed to post in a conspicuous place a current daily planned program of activities. The surveyor inquired about the daily planned program of activities and was directed to a lesson plan that was posted on a cabinet door in the back of the art room. The lesson plan was not legible and did not include a date. The director stated the children eat snack in the art room and in there for only fifteen (15) minutes. The surveyor went to the cafeteria and inquired about the daily planned program of activities and the staff person stated that they do what the other group does which is eat snack, work on homework and play outside. The director indicated that the children are there only three (3) hours or less. The director stated lesson plans were available in her office.
