922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

- (16) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:
- (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;
 - (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and
 - (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation and the Training Records Information System (TRIS), the following was found:

1. One staff person (hire date: 7/2/12) completed the pediatric abusive head trauma training class on 3/28/13; therefore, this training is no longer valid.
2. One staff person (hire date: 2/6/12) completed the pediatric abusive head trauma training class on 3/15/12; therefore, this training is no longer valid.

922 KAR 2:120. Section 4. Premises Requirements.

- (20) An outdoor play area shall be:
 - (d) Safe from foreseeable hazard;
 - (e) Well drained;
 - (f) Well maintained;
 - (g) In good repair; and
 - (h) Visible to staff at all times.

Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, this regulatory requirement was not met. The surveyor arrived at the facility and observed orange plastic temporary fencing being used to block off the entrance to the children's playground area. A pile of wooden boards was observed stacked in the middle of the playground and it appeared as though new equipment was being installed.

The staff person in charge stated during interview that they started renovations on the playground during the mandated Covid-19 closure period and indicated that the person they hired to do the project has not shown back up to finish. Therefore, the playground is still closed.

922 KAR 2:090. Section 9. Records.

- (1) A child-care center shall maintain:
 - (b) A written record for each child:
 1. Completed and signed by the child's parent;
 2. Retained on file on the first day the child attends the child-care center; and
 3. To contain:
 - a. Identifying information about the child, which includes, at a minimum, the child's name, address, and date of birth;
 - b. Contact information to enable a person in charge to contact the child's:
 - (i) Parent at the parent's home or place of employment;
 - (ii) Family physician; and
 - (iii) Preferred hospital;
 - c. The name of each person who is designated in writing to pick-up the child;
 - d. The child's general health status and medical history including, if applicable:
 - (i) Allergies;
 - (ii) Restriction on the child's participation in activities with specific instructions from the child's parent or health professional; and
 - (iii) Permission from the parent for third-party professional services in the child-care center;
 - e. The name and phone number of each person to be contacted in an emergency involving or impacting the child;
 - f. Authorization by the parent for the child-care center to seek emergency medical care for the child in the parent's absence;

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, this regulatory requirement was not met. One child's file/enrollment paperwork did not have physician contact information and it did not contain information for the family's preferred hospital.
