General: Based on review of documentation, it was found that the facility's general liability insurance that was on file was no longer current. It has expired in October of 2020.

General: Based on observation, it was found that there was a broom being stored in the bathroom used by the children. This was accessible to the children and is not a proper method of storage as it promotes the spread of germs.

General: Based on review of documentation, it was found that two (2) children's files did not have a preferred hospital listed on their enrollment paperwork at the facility.

General: Based on review of documentation, it was found that there was no information from the Kentucky Consumer Product Safety Program, as well as the Child and Parent Rights information, posted in the facility.
