Findings: <p>General: Based on review of documentation and interview, this regulatory requirement was not met. It was found that sometime between 3:45 and 4:00 p.m. on 7/9/19 a fifteen-month-old female child received burns which turned into blisters on the palms of her hands after placing them on hot blacktop on the outdoor playground. In an interview, the staff person indicated she was not sure of the time of day but she usually takes the children outside around 3:30 p.m. The teacher stated she observed the fifteen-month-old child crawling behind the play apparatus positioned in the center of the playground. She then heard the child crying. When she got to the child, the child was seated on the blacktop in front of in front of a purple bench. She added that the child was trying to stand up. She immediately picked the child up and examined her hands. The teacher stated she observed blisters on the child's palms. She immediately took the children inside and notified the staff person in charge of what happened. The staff person in charge examined the child's hands and observed that the child's palms were red. She stated she put cool water on the child's hands and wrapped them in gauze and medical tape. She then contacted the director and informed her of the incident. The staff person in charge stated she continued to check the child's hands and later found blisters had formed on the child's palms. The child's guardian was contacted immediately and it was recommended that the child have medical attention. The director indicated that the child was seen by a physician on the morning of 7/10/19.</p> <p>At the time of the visit conducted on 7/11/19 the surveyor inspected the outdoor play area used for the toddlers. There is a low octagon shaped structure with tall sides and a top is located in the middle of the area. There is a large opening on one (1) side and a very low edge which allows the children easy access inside the structure. The play structure sits on a blue and black poured cushioned surface. A canopy covers the poured surface. However, a section of the side facing the parking lot was exposed to the sun. Along the outside edges of the poured surface there is approximately four (4) feet of blacktop that is exposed to the sun and inside the chain link fence. Several plastic toddler chairs and benches as well as a Little Tikes picnic table were observed sitting on the blacktop against the fence. It should be noted that during interviews it was found that the staff person in charge assured there were no heat advisories for the area on 7/9/19. It was further stated that the sky had been overcast the entire day.</p>
