General: Based on observation, interview and review of documentation, a child, over 24 months old, was combined with the toddler children from 7:10 a.m. until 8:50 a.m. Interviews determined the two-year-old child was with the toddler children more than one hour daily.

There were numerous dead bugs along the baseboard, by the trash can, near the exit door and behind the child's kitchen set in the school-age room. There were cob webs in the corner by the exit door in the infants' room and along the bottom of the crates in the school age room. There was dirt and grime along the baseboards in the infants' room and school-age room.

General: Based on observation, a toddler and a preschool child did not wash their hands when they arrived.

General: Based on observation, a toddler swing had dried, loose dirt on the seat and tray located beside the door in the toddlers' outdoor play area.

- (2) Indoor and outdoor equipment shall:
- (a) Be clean, safe, and in good repair;
- (b) Meet the physical, developmental needs, and interests of children of different age groups;
- (c) Be free from sharp points or corners, splinters, protruding nails or bolts, loose or rusty parts, hazardous small parts, lead-based paint, poisonous material, and flaking or chalking paint; and
 - (d) Be designed to guard against entrapment or situations that may cause strangulation.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the paint was chipped on top of the brown table in the preschool classroom. There were two (2) brown spots that partially cover one ceiling tile and one (1) large brown spot covered one ceiling tile in the preschool room. Interview determined the roof previously leaked. The corner of the ABC rug had frayed edges in the preschool room. The bear rug had dark spots on the fabric in the toddler room. The adult-size chair cushion had large black dark stains in the toddlers' room. The ceiling vent had an excessive amount of dust located in the hallway. The white pillow had brown stains in the school age room. One (1) ceiling light flickered continuously in the hallway restroom and one (1) celling light did not work in the infants' room. A baseball size brown stain was on one (1) ceiling tile in the school age room.

Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, there was one (1) can of powder formula stored in an infant's cubbie. Interview confirmed caregivers prepared the bottles in the classroom. The powdered formula was measured by the parent but the water was measured by the caregivers and then mixed with the formula.
