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General: Based on review of documentation, a caregiver hired on 3/12/18, did not have an annual written performance evaluation on file.

(I) Assure the health, safety, and comfort of each child;

Findings

General: Based on observation, an electrical outlet was not covered in the three-year-olds' room. Four (4) electrical outlets were not covered in the after school room #1. An electrical outlet adjacent to a washer and dryer was uncovered in the restroom next to the preschool room. A child had a nickel size necklace pendant in his mouth in the three-year-olds' room.

560 - Building Requirements Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 4. Premises Requirements.

- (5) The building shall be constructed to ensure the:
- (a) Building is:
- 1. Dry;
- 2. Ventilated; and
- 3. Well lit, including clean light fixtures that are:
- a. In good repair in all areas; and
- b. Shielded or have shatter-proof bulbs installed; and
- (b) Following are protected:
- 1. Windows;
- 2. Doors;
- 3. Stoves;
- 4. Heaters;
- 5. Furnaces;
- 6. Pipes; and
- 7. Stairs.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, eight (8) bulbs were not shatterproof or shielded in the restroom near the three-year-olds' classroom, in a restroom next to the preschool room, and in the men's restroom next to the laundry room. Six (6) bulb light bulbs were not shatterproof or shielded in the women's restroom next to the laundry room.

580 - Floors, Walls, Ceilings

Findings:

General: Based on observation, a six (6) inch long area of baseboard was missing from the wall and exposed broken drywall and a wooden stud in the one-year-olds' room. An area of peeled plaster was on the ceiling next to the ceiling vent in the women's restroom next to the laundry room.

645 - Sink Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 10. Toilet, Diapering, and Toiletry Requirements.

- (3) A sink shall be:
- (a) Located in or immediately adjacent to toilet rooms;
- (b) Equipped with hot and cold running water that allows for hand washing;
- (c) Equipped with hot water at a minimum temperature of ninety (90) degrees Fahrenheit and a maximum of 120 degrees Fahrenheit;
- (d) Equipped with liquid soap;
- (e) Equipped with hand-drying blower or single use disposable hand drying material;
- (f) Equipped with an easily cleanable waste receptacle; and
- (g) Immediately adjacent to a changing area used for infants and toddlers.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the hot water temperature registered one hundred forty (140) degrees Fahrenheit at a sink in the two-year-olds' room, at a sink in the women's restroom next to the laundry room, and at a sink in the after school room #1. The hot water temperature registered one hundred thirty-seven (137) degrees Fahrenheit at a sink in the three-year-olds' room.

650 - Toilet Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 10. Toilet, Diapering, and Toiletry Requirements.

- (4) Each toilet shall:
- (a) Be kept in clean condition;
- (b) Be kept in good repair;
- (c) Be in a lighted room; and
- (d) Have ventilation to outside air.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, a toilet was clogged in the women's restroom next to the laundry room.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, dirt marks were left on the face of a child in the three-year-olds' room. The class previously played in the outdoor play area.

General: Based on observation, a towel, paper plate, restaurant cup, plastic cup lid and candy wrappers were scattered on the ground in the outdoor play area.

- (a) Be provided for outdoor play equipment used to:

General: Based on observation, a Little Tikes Slide was placed on concrete on the outdoor playground.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, a sandbox, not in use, was partially uncovered in the outdoor play area next to the outdoor playground.

795 - Individual Bed/Mat/Cot and Bedding

General: Based on observation, a blue nap mat was torn along the seam in the restroom adjacent to the one-year-olds' room.



820 - Indoor/Outdoor Equipment

922 KAR 2:120. Section 11. Toys and Furnishings.

- (2) Indoor and outdoor equipment shall:
- (a) Be clean, safe, and in good repair;
- (b) Meet the physical, developmental needs, and interests of children of different age groups;
- (c) Be free from sharp points or corners, splinters, protruding nails or bolts, loose or rusty parts, hazardous small parts, lead-based paint, poisonous material, and flaking or chalking paint; and
- (d) Be designed to guard against entrapment or situations that may cause strangulation.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, a foot pedal was missing from two (2) red tricycles in the outdoor play area. The rim and backboard were missing from a plastic basketball hoop system on the outdoor playground. Sharp edges and a broken leg was on a blue, plastic stepstool in the outdoor play area. An area rug with children's printed faces and a gray area rug were soiled with several dark spots in the two-year-olds' room. Black smudges were across a white, half door in the three-year-olds' room. White smears were on a mirror next to gray shelves in the preschool room.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, a face mask, license plate cover, and candy wrappers were on the floor of the center's van. In addition, a plastic drinking straw and a brown crumbled food substance were wedge between a seat on the last row of the center's van.

960 - Children's Transportation Records

Findings:

General: Based on observation and review of documentation, the time each child got on and off the center's van was not documented for seven (7) children transported during the week of 10/28/20, for eight (8) children transported during the weeks of 10/05/20 and 10/14/20, for ten (10) children transported during the weeks of 10/12/20 and 10/21/20, and for four (4) children transported during the week of 11/9/20.

Due to the current declared public health emergency caused by the Novel Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19), licensed child care centers must operate under Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and public health guidelines, as mandated by 922 KAR 2:405E, to prevent the spread of COVID-19.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, the center failed to ensure new staff shall undergo name-based background in accordance with 922 KAR 2:280. Two (2) caregivers hired on 10/12/20, and 10/26/20 did not have a processed name-based criminal record check on file. In addition, the center failed to assure all child care staff, directors, owners and operators complete a new, mandatory training on cleaning, sanitizing, health procedures, and mandatory reporting prior to the date of reopening, in accordance with 922 KAR 2:405E Section 9 (1). A caregiver hired on 3/12/18, did not complete the reopening training.



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
