General: Based on review of documentation, a caregiver hired on 9/17/21, did not have a processed background check and was present at the center.

<b>Findings:</b>	
General: Based on observation and review of documentation, two (2) electrical outlets were uncovered in the preschool room. Three (3) electrical outlets were uncovered in the school age room and in the kindergarteners' room. One (1) electrical outlet was uncovered in the infants' room. Five (5) electrical outlets were uncovered in the one-year-olds' room and school age room. A sink was used for handwashing and washing bottles in the infants' room. Long chunks of pulled pork was served to three (3), one-year-old children in the infants' room. Three (3), one-year-old children each sat in a highchair that was missing safety straps during lunch in the infants' room. A caregiver hired on 5/12/21, did not have a name-based child abuse/neglect check on file. A caregiver hired on 5/17/21, did not have a child abuse/neglect check and a sex offender registry check on file from Indiana, which was a previous state of residence.

**Findings:**

General: Based on review of documentation, a caregiver hired on 3/6/18, had TB documentation on file dated 9/2/19. A caregiver hired on 6/2/18, had TB documentation on file dated 7/17/19. A caregiver hired on 3/15/18, had TB documentation on file dated 7/17/19. Two (2) caregivers hired on 5/17/21 and 5/18/21, did not have TB documentation on file.

**435 - Training****Not In Compliance****922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.****(16) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:**

**Findings:**

General: Based on review of documentation, a caregiver hired on 3/6/18, completed fourteen and a half (14 ½) hours of training during a subsequent year of employment. Three (3) caregivers hired on 5/12/21, 5/18/21, and 5/17/21, each did not complete six (6) hours of orientation training within the first three (3) months of employment. Two (2) caregivers hired on 3/15/18 and 4/23/19, each did not complete training hours during a subsequent year of employment.

General: Based on review of documentation, four (4) caregivers hired on 3/12/18, 9/2/19, 6/2/18, 4/18/18, did not have a driver's history record on file.

General: Based on observation, there was no daily planned program of activities posted in the two-year-olds' room, one-year-olds' room, after school age room, and kindergarteners' room.

The hot water registered one hundred and fifty (150) degrees Fahrenheit at a sink in a restroom, near the two-year-olds' room. The hot water registered one hundred and forty (140) degrees Fahrenheit at a sink in the men's restroom near the school age room, at a sink in the ladies' restroom near the school age room, at a sink in the infants' room, and at a sink in the school age room. The hot water registered seventy-four (74) degrees Fahrenheit at a sink in the one-year-olds' room.

- (b) Be stored out of reach of a child;**
- (c) Be periodically inventoried to ensure the supplies have not expired;**
- (d) If reusable, be:**
  - 1. Sanitized; and**
  - 2. Maintained in a sanitary manner; and**
- (e) Include:**
  - 1. Liquid soap;**
  - 2. Adhesive bandages;**
  - 3. Sterile gauze;**
  - 4. Medical tape;**
  - 5. Scissors;**
  - 6. A thermometer;**

**Findings:**

General: Based on observation, first aid supplies on the center's van did not include scissors, a CPR mouth shield, and hand soap. Also, the flashlight was inoperable.

**Outdoor Play Area****Not In Compliance****790 - Playground Clean****Not In Compliance****922 KAR 2:120. Section 4. Premises Requirements.****(20) An outdoor play area shall be:****(c) Free from:**

- 1. Litter;**
- 2. Glass;**

**Findings:**

General: Based on observation, food wrappers, plastic water bottles, an empty box of Kleenex, and a child's pink sock were scattered on the younger children's outdoor play area. Also, candy wrappers, plastic cups, a paper plate, orange peelings, a pink and black child's sock, and a paper towel roll were scattered across the older children's outdoor play area.

**795 - Playground Conditions****Not In Compliance****922 KAR 2:120. Section 4. Premises Requirements.****(20) An outdoor play area shall be:**

- (d) Safe from foreseeable hazard;**
- (e) Well drained;**
- (f) Well maintained;**

**Findings:**

General: Based on observation, tall weeds were on the younger children's outdoor play area. The tallest weed was approximately four and a half (4 1/2) feet tall. Also, tall weeds were on the older children's outdoor play area. There were gaps between several black, square rubber tiles on the older children's outdoor play area. The largest gap between the rubber tiles was approximately four (4) inches wide and created a tripping hazard.

General: Based on observation, the center's Statement of Deficiencies and Plan of Correction for the current licensure year and information on the Kentucky Consumer Product Safety Program and the program's website were not posted.

**Findings:**

General: Based on observation, there was no date on the schedule of daily activities posted in the preschool room and two-year-olds' room. There was no date and times on the schedule of daily activities posted in the infants' room. Also, there was no posted schedule of daily activities in the school age room, one-year-olds' room, after school age room, and kindergarten's room.

- (a) Unless:
  - 1. The animal is under the supervision and control of an adult;

**Findings:**

General: Based on observation and interview, a pet gecko lizard was in a glass tank in the school age room.
