This item was accessible to the children in care. 2) A latch on the left side cabinet door under the sink in the two-to-three year old classroom was not in working order, leading to access to garbage bags and loose grocery bags. 3) There was a bottle of bleach water spray located behind the faucet in the preschool classroom. The sink in this area is used by the children. The bleach spray was accessible to the children in care. the children in care.
