- (2) Except in accordance with subsection (3) of this section or Section 2(2)(c) of this administrative regulation, an infant or toddler under twenty-four (24) months of age shall not participate in an activity with an older child for no more than one (1) hour per day.
- (3) If a toddler is developmentally appropriate for a transition to a preschool age group, a toddler may participate in an activity with an older child for more than one (1) hour per day if:
- (a) Space for the toddler is available in the preschool-age group;
- (b) The staff-to-child ratios and group sizes are maintained based on the age of the youngest child;
- (c) The center has a procedure for listing a transitioning toddler on attendance records, including a specific day and time the toddler is with either age group; and
- (d) The child care center has obtained the signature and approval of the toddler's parent on the toddler's transition plan.

Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, there were seven children, ranging in age from two to three years old, being cared for in the Twos & Threes classroom. Five of the seven children present in the room were two-years-old. In an interview with the staff person in charge, it was determined that the facility did not have a procedure for transitioning toddlers or signed approval from the toddlers' parents on a transition plan.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, there was an open box of plastic garbage bags being store in a cabinet under the sink in the Twos & Threes classroom. The child-locks on the cabinet doors were worn and not engaging. The bags were accessible to the children in care.

580 - Floors, Walls, Ceilings

Findings:

General: Based on observation, there were three areas of chipping paint on the wall in the reading area in the Twos & Threes classroom. The areas left exposed drywall and were accessible to the children in care.

- 2. Diaper cream, sunscreen, or toothpaste. Diaper cream, sunscreen, or toothpaste shall be inaccessible to a child;
- 3. An epinephrine auto-injector. A licensed child-care center shall comply with KRS 199.8951 and 311.646, including:
- a. An epinephrine auto-injector shall be inaccessible to a child;

Due to the current declared public health emergency caused by the Novel Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19), licensed child care centers must operate under Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and public health guidelines, as mandated by 922 KAR 2:405E, to prevent the spread of COVID-19.

Findings:

General: Based on observation and review of documentation, the following was found:

- 1. Upon entering the Infant classroom, the staff person's face mask was being worn under her chin. The mask was not covering the staff person's mouth and nose.
- 2. Upon entering the Twos & Threes classroom, the staff person's face mask was being worn under her chin. The mask was not covering the staff person's mouth and nose.
- 3. Staff hired 4/3/2017, did not have evidence of completing the required training for the re-opening of child care facilities. A review of ECE-TRIS records supports the information found during the survey.
