revealed that on 5/1/17 a three-year-old child in care was able to access bleach in the classroom bathroom that led to the child requiring medical attention due to contact with the bleach. Interview with the director revealed that on 5/1/17 a child in care had come into contact with bleach that required the contacting of poison control and medical attention. Additional interviews with staff and individuals present during the incident, confirmed that the child's skin and cloths had come into contact with bleach that required the removal of the child's cloths and medical attention due to suspicion of ingestion of bleach and redness to the skin.

(7) Except in accordance with subsection (8) of this section, the following shall be inaccessible to a child in care:

(a) Toxic cleaning supplies, poisons, and insecticides;

(b) Knives and sharp objects;

(c) Matches, cigarettes, lighters, and flammable liquids;

(d) Plastic bags;

(e) Litter and rubbish;

(f) Bar soap; and

(g) Personal belongings and medications of staff.

Findings:

General: Based on Review of Documentation and interview, the child care center failed to maintain the premises in accordance with regulations. Review of Documentation on 5/8/17 concerning an incident on 5/1/17 revealed a bottle of bleach was left in the classroom bathroom that was accessible to children in care. Interview with the director revealed the bleach is stored in the kitchen away from children and that a staff member placed the bleach in the classroom bathroom. Continued interviews with staff and individuals present during the incident revealed the child accessed the bleach in the bathroom that resulted in the need for medical care.
