General: Based on review of documentation and interview, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulatory requirements. Upon request, the child care center staff-in-charge failed to provide documented evidence of a high school diploma, GED or qualifying documentation from a comparable educational entity for staff with a hire date of 10/08/18. The staff was stated to have supervisory control of children in care.

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain the outdoor play area in accordance with regulatory requirements. Observation of the outdoor play area revealed the play area was not maintained as the fencing area contained weeds and dried vines.

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain outdoor play equipment in accordance with regulatory requirements. Observation of the outdoor play area revealed a tall gray climbing apparatus and swing set which contained rusted metal surfaces. In addition, a tall wooden jungle gym was observed with chipped and splintered pieces of wood, rusted nails and sharp corners in areas of play on the structure.

Observation of Room #3 and Room #6 revealed thirty-three (33) children present. Review of attendance records revealed twenty-nine (29) children were signed in to care. Interview with the child care center director revealed some children were not signed in properly by their parents.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, the child care center failed to maintain written documentation in accordance with regulatory requirements. Upon request, the child care center director failed to provide documented evidence that the child care center conducted quarterly earthquake and tornado drills detailing the date, time and children who participated for the 1st, 2nd, and 3rd Quarters of 2018. In addition, the director failed to provide documented evidence that monthly fire drills were conducted detailing the date, time and children who participated for the months of December 2017 through May 2018, November 2018 and December 2018.

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1195 - Fire Drills Not In Compliance

- (12) A fire drill shall be:
- (a) Conducted during hours of operation at least monthly; and
- (b) Documented.
- (13) An earthquake drill and a tornado drill shall be:

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, the child care center failed to maintain written documentation in accordance with regulatory requirements. Upon request, the child care center director failed to provide documented evidence that the child care center conducted quarterly earthquake and tornado drills in the 1st, 2nd, and 3rd Quarters of 2018. In addition, the director failed to provide documented evidence that monthly fire drills were conducted for the months of December 2017, January 2018 through May 2018, November 2018 and December 2018.
