- (4) For a child-care center licensed for school-age children, at least one (1) person on duty and present with the children shall be currently certified by a cabinet-approved training agency in the following skills:
- (a) Adult cardiopulmonary resuscitation; and
- (b) First aid.
- (5) Cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) and first aid training shall be in addition to the fifteen (15) clock hours requirement in subsection (16) of this section.

## Findings:

General: Based on observation and review of documentation, it was found that only one person at the facility has current CPR/First Aid certification. During the time of the survey, this person was not present at the facility. Therefore, no one was present during the survey who had a current CPR/First Aid certification. This survey was approximately one hour and 15 minutes long.

#### Findings:

General: Based on observation, the following was found:

- 1.) In the computer lab, there were cleaners within reach of the children. They were sitting in a bucket on top of a podium.
- 2.) In the library, there was a spray bottle that contained soap water sitting on top of a shelf.
- 3.) In classroom 211, there were two bottles of hand sanitizer, a spray bottle of bleach, and a teacher's Starbucks drink within reach of the children. All of these items were accessible to the children at the time of the inspection.

- a. Identifying information about the child, which includes, at a minimum, the child's name, address, and date of birth;
- b. Contact information to enable a person in charge to contact the child's:
- (i) Parent at the parent's home or place of employment;
- (ii) Family physician; and
- (iii) Preferred hospital;
- c. The name of each person who is designated in writing to pick-up the child;
- d. The child's general health status and medical history including, if applicable:
- (i) Allergies;
- (ii) Restriction on the child's participation in activities with specific instructions from the child's parent or health professional; and
- (iii) Permission from the parent for third-party professional services in the child-care center;
- e. The name and phone number of each person to be contacted in an emergency involving or impacting the child;
- f. Authorization by the parent for the child-care center to seek emergency medical care for the child in the parent's absence;

General: Based on review of documentation, the following was found:

- One child's file did not list a physician's contact information.
- 2.) One child's file did contain a physician's name, but did not list the contact phone number.
