General: Based on review of documentation and interview, a caregiver hired 8/23/21 completed eight and a half (8.50) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment in a child care program. Caregiver hired 5/22/17, completed two and a half (2.50) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during the subsequent year of employment. Caregiver hired 12/22/20, completed twelve (12) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during the subsequent year of employment. Caregiver hired 10/5/99, completed ten and a half (10.50) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during the subsequent year of employment. Caregiver hired 3/29/22, did not complete six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation training within the first three (3) months of employment.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, interview and review of documentation, the medication log revealed a child was given Mylicon .3 ml three (3) times daily after each feeding, however, the person who administered the Mylicon on 08/02/22 and 08/03/22 was not documented. Review of the medication sheet determined the same child had taken the same prescription three (3) times daily since 08/01/22, but only documented the medication sheet one (1) time daily.

- (a) Stored in a separate and locked place, out of the reach of a child unless the medication is:

- 2. Diaper cream, sunscreen, or toothpaste. Diaper cream, sunscreen, or toothpaste shall be inaccessible to a child;
- 3. An epinephrine auto-injector. A licensed child-care center shall comply with KRS 199.8951 and 311.646, including:
- a. An epinephrine auto-injector shall be inaccessible to a child;
- b. A child-care center shall have at least one (1) person onsite who has received training on the administration of an epinephrine auto-injector if the child-care center maintains an epinephrine auto-injector;

- d. A child-care center shall report to the child's parent and the cabinet in accordance with 922 KAR 2:090, Section 13(1)(b) if an epinephrine auto-injector is administered to a child; or
- 4. An emergency or rescue medication for a child in care, such as medication to respond to diabetic or asthmatic condition, as prescribed by the child's physician. Emergency or rescue medication shall be inaccessible to a child in care;
- (b) Kept in the original bottle: and
- (c) Properly labeled.
- (7) Medication shall not be given to a child if the medication's expiration date has passed.

General: Based on observation, a tube of Boudreaux's Butt Paste, stored in a locked box in room 118, was not labeled to indicate for whom it was intended.

The paint was chipped and rust was on the yellow metal school bus on the younger children's playground. The plastic covering on a red bench was busted in several areas on the older children's playground. The paint was chipped and rust was on the yellow metal space shuttle on the older children's playground. The plastic fabric seat of a Fisher Price Bouncer was torn in several areas and exposed foam in room 118/Nursery. A blue area rug and two (2) multicolored rugs were heavily soiled and stained in room 130. A multicolor area rug was heavily soiled and had dark spots in room 124/Toddler 2 classroom. The wooden seat on an adult-size rocker was busted in room 118/Nursery. The passenger side second row door would not open on the 2001 Ford E350 Van.

In addition, a child enrolled on 05/20/22, did not have a preferred hospital listed in the enrollment information.
