General: Based on observation and interview, a caregiver discovered a child (DOB 09/02/04) went into a storage closet, and some how stuck an EpiPen in his thumb at 7:05 a.m. on 09/20/12. Caregivers were unaware as to where the child got the Epi-Pen.

General: Based on observation and interviews, two (2) caregivers (DOH 08/2012 and 09/2012) supervised forty-three (43), five to twelve year old children, in the gym, from approximately 3:00 p.m. to 3:15 p.m. on 09/25/12.

Findings

General: Based on interviews, a child stuck an EpiPen in his thumb on 09/20/12. The EpiPen did not belong to the child and caregivers were not aware where the child obtained the EpiPen.

General: Based on observation, the closet door was open and the items inside were accessible to children. Inside the janitor's closet were several brooms and large trash bags on the floor. A 1/4 quart of Pleascent Clean, a spray bottle of general purpose cleaner (less than 100ml), disinfectant cleaner (400ml), glass cleaner (750ml) and three (3) empty cleaner bottles were stored on a shelf, accessible to children.
