# Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, the toddlers' caregiver (hired 02/20/18) walked out of the toddlers' room and closed the door. The caregiver went to the children's cubbies which were located directly across from the toddlers' room. The caregiver left four (4) children, infant to one-year-old, alone for less than a minute. Surveyor heard a child cry when the caregiver shut the door.

## Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, the staff in charge (hired 09/06/06) was observed outside the center, shutting a car door, when surveyor arrived. Upon entering the center, surveyor observed the infant/toddlers' caregiver (hired 03/23/17) supervised six (6) children, with an infant being the youngest; therefore, the minimum staff/child ratio was not maintained. Interview with the infant/toddler caregiver (hired 03/23/17) determined the staff in charge (hired 09/06/06), left the center for about a minute to go to her car.

922 KAR 2:120. Section 7. First Aid and Medicine.

- (6) Medication, including refrigerated medication, shall be:
- (a) Stored in a separate and locked place, out of the reach of a child unless the medication is:
- 1. A first aid supply and is maintained in accordance with subsection (1) of this section;
- 2. Diaper cream, sunscreen, or toothpaste. Diaper cream, sunscreen, or toothpaste shall be inaccessible to a child;
- 3. An epinephrine auto-injector. In accordance with KRS 199.8951:
- a. An epinephrine auto-injector shall be inaccessible to a child;
- b. A child-care center shall have at least one person onsite who has received training on the administration of an epinephrine auto-injector if the child-care center maintains an epinephrine auto-injector;
  - c. A child-care center shall seek emergency medical care for a child if an auto-injector is administered to the child; and
- d. A child-care center shall report to the child's parent and the cabinet in accordance with 922 KAR 2:090, Section 12 if an epinephrine autoinjector is administered to a child: or
- 4. An emergency or rescue medication for a child in care, such as medication to respond to diabetic or asthmatic condition, as prescribed by the child's physician. Emergency or rescue medication shall be inaccessible to a child in care;
- (b) Kept in the original bottle; and
- (c) Properly labeled.
- (7) Medication shall not be given to a child if the medication's expiration date has passed.

#### Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, a bottle of Children's acetaminophen and a bottle of Infants' Tylenol were not labeled to indicate for whom each was intended. These medications were stored in an unlocked medicine box located on top of the refrigerator. A second bottle of children's acetaminophen was stored in an unlocked medicine box located on top of the refrigerator.
