General: Based on interview and review of documentation, a staff member cared for six (6) children alone from 6:30 am to 7:00 am on 07/26/2021 and 07/27/2021 in Room #3. The age of the youngest child was an infant.

- (2) Indoor and outdoor equipment shall: (a) Be clean, safe, and in good repair;
- (b) Meet the physical, developmental needs, and interests of children of different age groups;
- (c) Be free from sharp points or corners, splinters, protruding nails or bolts, loose or rusty parts, hazardous small parts, lead-based paint, poisonous material, and flaking or chalking paint; and
- (d) Be designed to guard against entrapment or situations that may cause strangulation.

Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, an infant sat in a Bumbo seat without a restraint belt in Room #3. A review of the Consumer Product Safety Commission recall information determined the Bumbo seat was recalled in 2007 and instructed consumers to order a free repair kit, which included a restraint belt and a warning label. Interview determined the center was not aware of the recall. The caregiver stated the Bumbo seat was used daily.
