General: Upon request, a staff evaluation for two (2) staff members with the hire dates 09-05-2018 and 08-05-2016 was not presented for review.

General: Observation of the hallway in building one (1) revealed an electrical outlet that did not have a face plate on it, exposing the electrical outlet. Observation of the block center located in the purple room in building two (2) revealed a short wooden shelf used to store children's toys had television wires and ipad charging wires stored on top of the shelf, accessible to the children.

Findings:

General: Observation of the wooden entry door in room 4A revealed there was a large area of the door that was missing a piece of wood, the door was splintery and not smooth. The rough area of the door was accesssible to the children. Further observation of the door revealed two (2) plastic pieces secured into the door that was broken and had sharp edges. Observation of a wall in the boy's restroom located in building one (1) revealed there was paint peeling behind five (5) toilets. Observation of the purple room located in building two (2) revealed a wall under the window was peeling paint.

580 - Floors, Walls, Ceilings

922 KAR 2:120. Section 4. Premises Requirements.

(9) Floors, walls, and ceilings shall be smooth, in good repair, and constructed to be easily cleaned.

Findings:

General: Observation of the ceiling in room 4A revealed numerous holes in the ceiling tiles throughout the classroom. Further observation of the ceiling revealed there was one (1) ceiling tile sagging and the insulation was exposed. Observation of the girl's restroom located off the main hallway in building one (1) revealed there were six (6) brown ceramic floor tiles that were broken and one (1) hole in the ceramic tile floor located in the handicap stall. Observation of a wall in the main hallway located in building two (2) revealed there were two (2) holes in the wall and the dry wall was exposed.

645 - Sink **Not In Compliance**

922 KAR 2:120. Section 10. Toilet, Diapering, and Toiletry Requirements.

- (3) A sink shall be:
- (a) Located in or immediately adjacent to toilet rooms;
- (b) Equipped with hot and cold running water that allows for hand washing:
- (c) Equipped with hot water at a minimum temperature of ninety (90) degrees Fahrenheit and a maximum of 120 degrees Fahrenheit;
- (d) Equipped with liquid soap;
- (e) Equipped with hand-drying blower or single use disposable hand drying material;
- (f) Equipped with an easily cleanable waste receptacle; and
- (g) Immediately adjacent to a changing area used for infants and toddlers.

Findings:

General: Observation of the sinks in the boy's restroom located off the main hallway in building one (1) revealed three (3) sinks; the water temperature in the second sink exceeded one-hundred-twenty (120) degrees Fahrenheit. Further observation of the three (3) sinks revealed a mass build-up of dried debris around all three (3) of the water faucets.

650 - Toilet Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 10. Toilet, Diapering, and Toiletry Requirements.

- (a) Be kept in clean condition;
- (b) Be kept in good repair;

Findings:

General: Observation of the girl's restroom located off of the main hallway in building one (1) revealed seven (7) toilets that had a build-up of dust and debris on the back of the toilet. Additionally, the silver, metal pipes connected to the toilet and the wall had a dried bright green substance on all of them.

Further observation of the changing table revealed a build-up of dust and debris on all of the storage shelves attached to the changing

General: Observation of the outside playground revealed two (2) blue slides where the ground was visible through the protective surfacing. Continued observation of the play appartaus revealed one (1) swing where the ground was visible through the protective surfacing.

- (d) Be designed to guard against entrapment or situations that may cause strangulation.

Findings:

General: Observation of the carpet in room 4A revealed it was unraveling, leaving a long piece of woven material causing a potential tripping hazard. Observation of the outside playground revealed three (3) concrete splash blocks located under the water spouts and attached to the child care center were broken, leaving the concrete with sharp pointy edges. In interview, the director stated the children play in the area where the broken concrete splash blocks were. Observation of the outside playground revealed six (6) concrete blocks that were on the outside perimeter of the wooden picnic table. The concrete blocks were a potential tripping hazard. In interview, the director stated the picnic table legs were supposed to be set on the blocks so the table would not sink into the mulch. Observation of a wooden structure revealed the red paint was chipping off in various areas of the structure; there was a piece of wood securing the slide that was rotted and splintery. Further observation of the wooden climbing structure revealed a yellow climbing chain with four (4) wooden planks dividing the chains that were rotted and the wood was splintery on the outside edges.

Findings:

General: Review of ten (10) children's files revealed the following: 1. One (1) file did not contain information of the family's preferred hospital for the child with enrollment date 08-07-2020; 2. One (1) file did not contain the child's general health status and medical history for the child with enrollment date 08-04-2020; and 3. One (1) file did not contain the family's preferred physician for the child with the enrollment date 07/26/2020.
