(1) Effective with the adoption of this administrative regulation, a director shall: (I) Provide for the health, safety, and comfort of each child; Findings: Based on interview, on 10-15-13 at about 9:50 a.m., a child was struck in the head with a cot as a staff person was putting the cots out for nap time. As the staff person was carrying the cot past the children watching a television program, two children were grabbing at her feet which caused her to loose her balance and the hard plastic corner edge of the cot struck a child on the back edge of her head resulting in the child requiring two staples to her head as applied by a health professional. 270 - Parent Notification In Compliance 922 KAR 2:110. (1) A child-care center shall maintain:

- (b) A written record for each child:
- 1. Completed and signed by the child's parent;
- 2. Retained on file on the first day the child attends the child-care center; and

3. To contain:

- a. Identifying information about the child, which includes, at minimum, the child's name, address, and date of birth;
- b. Contact information to enable a person in charge to contact the child's:
- (i) Parent at the parent's home or place of employment;
- (ii) Family physician; and
- (iii) Preferred hospital;

c. The name of each person who is designated in writing to pick-up the child;

- d. The child's general health status and medical history including, if applicable:
- (i) Allergies;

(ii) Restriction on the child's participation in activities with specific instructions from the child's parent or health professional; and

(iii) Permission from the parent for third-party professional services in the child-care center;

e. The name and phone number of each person to be contacted in an emergency situation involving or impacting the child;

f. Authorization by the parent for the child-care center to seek emergency medical care for the child in the parent's absence;
