General: Based on review of documentation, there was no evidence of an up to date CPR/First aid certification for any adult in the home, including the provider. All certificates on file expired on 3/30/21.

265 - Provider Training Requirements

Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:100 - Section 10. Standards for the Provider.

(1)(a) Between July 1 and June 30 of the following calendar year, a provider shall complete at least nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training beginning with the second year of operation, including one and one-half (1½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training in accordance with KRS 199.8982(2) to be completed:

- 1. Within the second year of employment or operation in child care; and
- 2. Every subsequent five (5) years of employment or operation in child care.
- (b) A provider or assistant's compliance with the training in accordance with paragraph (a) of this subsection or subsection (8) of this section shall be verified through the cabinet-designed database maintained pursuant to 922 KAR 2:240.

Findings

General: Based on review of documentation, it was determined that the provider did not complete the nine hours of required annual training for the year. A review of ECE-TRIS confirmed this finding.

General: Based on observation, this regulation was not met. The provider did not wash a child's hands after changing their diaper.

- b. Beyond twelve (12) months of age as documented by the parent or the child's physician;
- 2. Pasteurized whole milk to a child age twelve (12) months to twenty-four (24) months; or
- 3. Pasteurized skim or low fat one (1) percent milk to a child age twenty-four (24) months to school-age.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, this regulation was not met. The provider only had 2% milk available at the time of survey. The provider stated she was unaware she was supposed to be serving skim or 1% milk to children above 24 months of age.

General: Based on review of documentation, one child enrolled on 4/8/21, did not have an updated immunization record. The record on file expired on 1/8/22.

- f. Authorization by the parent for the provider to seek emergency medical care for the child in the parent's absence;

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, two children enrolled on 8/22/18 and 4/21/19 did not have physician's contact information on file. Also, one child enrolled on 1/1/18, did not have a preferred hospital listed on their enrollment forms.

- (b) Monthly practiced fire drills detailing the date, time, and participants in accordance with Section 12(19) of this administrative regulation;

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, there was no documentation made available during the survey of monthly fire drills being conducted.

795 - Evacuation Plan Records Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:100 - Section 19. Records.

(7)(a) A certified family child-care home provider shall have a written evacuation plan in the event of fire, natural disaster, or other threatening situation that may pose a health or safety hazard to a child in care in accordance with KRS 199.895.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, there was no evidence that the Emergency Preparedness Plan had been updated or submitted to the proper authority for review since 2018.
