General: Based on Observation, a two-month-old child was sleeping in a bouncy seat that had been placed inside a crib. The manufacturer's user's manual for the seat reads, "Not intended for sleep" and "Never use on a soft surface (bed, sofa, cusion) since product can tip over and cause suffocation on on soft surfaces."

General: Based on Review of Documentation, staff person hired September, 2017 did not have the results of or evidence of the application for a criminal background check on file in the facility. The staff person was alone in a classroom supervising five (5) children.

310 - Personnel File

- (e) A current personnel file for each child-care center staff person to include:
- 1. Name, address, date of birth, and date of employment;
- 2. Proof of educational qualifications;

- d. Number of clock hours completed;
- 5. Every two (2) years, a:
- a. Statement from a health professional that the individual is free of active tuberculosis; or
- b. Copy of negative tuberculin results; and

6. For a director, employee, volunteer, or any person with supervisory or disciplinary control over, or having unsupervised contact with, a child in care, the results of a:

- a. Child abuse or neglect check using the central registry in accordance with 922 KAR 1:470;
- b. Criminal records check required by KRS 199.896(19);
- c. Criminal records check from any previous state of residence completed once if:
- (i) The individual resided outside the state of Kentucky in the last five (5) years; and
- (ii) No criminal records check has been completed for the individual's previous state of residence; and
- d. An address check of the Sex Offender Registry;

General: Based on Review of Documentation, one (1) of the personnel files presented for review did not contain the hire date for the employee. In an interview with the director it was determined that the employee was hired September 2017.

315 - Educational Requirements

922 KAR 2:110. Section 5. Staff Requirements.

(1) Child-care center staff:

(a) Hired after January 1, 2009, who have supervisory power over a minor and are not enrolled in secondary education, shall have a:

1. High school diploma:

- 2. GED or qualifying documentation from a comparable educational entity; or
- 3. Commonwealth Child Care Credential as described in 922 KAR 2:250;

Findings:

General: Based on Review of Documentation, staff person hired September 2017, did not have evidence of proof of education on file in the facility.



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420 - Infant Sleep Position

922 KAR 2:120. Section 6. Sleeping and Napping Requirements. (1) An infant shall sleep or nap on the infant's back unless the infant's health professional signs a waiver that states the infant requires an alternate sleeping position.

Findings:

General: Based on Observation, a two-month-old child was sleeping in a bouncy seat in a crib in the Infant/Toddler classroom. In an interview with the staff person present it was stated that the child has issues with reflux and the parent asked that the child be propped up when sleeping. There was no statement from a physician on file indicating that the child's sleep position should be altered.

There were several plastic bags in a lower drawer under the sink in the bathroom used by the children. 3. There were three (3) bottles of hair product in an unlocked cabinet under the sink in the bathroom used by the children. The bottles read "Keep out of reach of children."

General: Based on Observation, it was determined that the staff person in the Infant/Toddler classroom was preparing formula in bottles for one (1) of the children in care. The facility does not provide formula for the children and the powdered formula was not pre-measured by the parent before mixing.
