## Findings:

General: Based on observation, the following was found to be accessible to the children in care:

- 1.) There were cans of spray paint sitting on a shelf on the deck. This deck was on the back of the house, leading to the playground area.
- 2.) In the laundry room, there was insect killer, bleach, paint, and trash bags. There was a baby gate in the laundry room, however, it was not engaged at the time of the survey.

General: Based on observation, it was found that there was missing and chipped paint on the walls in the middle classroom. In addition, it was found that there was missing and chipped paint on the baseboards in the front classroom.

In addition, it was found that there was a large piece of wood sticking up out of the ground in the back right-hand corner of the playground.

General: Based on observation, it was found during a tour of the kitcen that there were grapes, mashed potatoes, macaroni and cheese, biscuits, and chicken patties. All of these items were sitting out and did not have any kind of covering on them to protect them from contaminants.

General: Based on review of documentation, it was found that three children's files did not contain current immunization certificates.

- (ii) Restriction on the child's participation in activities with specific instructions from the child's parent or health professional; and
- (iii) Permission from the parent for third-party professional services in the child-care center;
- e. The name and phone number of each person to be contacted in an emergency involving or impacting the child;
- f. Authorization by the parent for the child-care center to seek emergency medical care for the child in the parent's absence;

#### Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, it was found that one child's file did not have a physician's contact listed on the enrollment paperwork.

922 KAR 2:405E. Emergency Regulation.

Due to the current declared public health emergency caused by the Novel Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19), licensed child care centers must operate under Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and public health guidelines, as mandated by 922 KAR 2:405E, to prevent the spread of COVID-19.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, it was found that one staff person did not have the required reopening training. A review of ECE-TRIS confirmed this finding.
