General: Based on observation, the following was found to be accessible to the children in care:

- 1.) There was an unlatched cabinet, which contained Lysol wipes, in the Three- to Four-year-old classroom. Additionally, a gray shelf contained deodorant and lotion. Both items were labeled, "Keep out of reach of children.
- 2.) The staff bathroom was located within the girls' restroom. The bathroom contained two aerosol spray bottles and a gallon of chemical cleaner.

General: Based on review of documentation, three children's files did not include a date of enrollment and emergency consent. Additionally, one child's file did not include medical history.

General: Based on review of documentation, the fire and tornado drill times were not documented separately. The two drills require different actions; therefore, the times should be documented separately.

General: Based on review of documentation, the statement of deficiency and plan of correction was stapled against the parent board; only the first page was visible and able to be inspected by the public.
