Findings:

General: Observation of the outside playground revealed a large climbing apparatus that did not have sufficient protective surfacing under and around the structure. The black landscape material that was under the protective surfacing was visible.

General: Based on interview and review of the presented ten (10) children's file, one (1) child's file with the enrollment date 08/20/2020 did not contain a parent's preferred hospital listed for review.

General: Upon request, the staff member in charge did not present verification that the evacuation plan in the event of a fire, natural disaster, or other threatening situation that may pose a health and safety hazard for a child in care had been submitted to the local emergency management team within the last year.

Findings:

General: Review of emergency drills revealed there was not documentation of a tornado drill and earthquake drill conducted for the fourth (4th) quarter of 2020. Interview with a staff member in-charge revealed the emergency drills had not been conducted.

General: Upon request, the Kentucky Consumer Product Safety Program and the programs website was not presented for review.

1260 - Emergency Regulation

922 KAR 2:410E. Emergency Regulation.

Due to the current declared public health emergency caused by the Novel Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19), licensed child care centers must operate under Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and public health guidelines, as mandated by 922 KAR 2:410E, to prevent the spread of COVID-19.

Findings:

General: The child care center failed to assure compliance with the requirements specific to the current pandemic as established in 922 KAR 2:410e. The standards established in 922 KAR 2:410e prohibit the use of machine washable toys. Observation of the pre-k3 classroom revealed a basket with three (3) dolls that were made of material was accessible to the children. Observation of the pre-k4a classroom revealed two (2) dolls made of cloth and child size dress-up clothes were made available to the children in the kitchen center. Observation of the pre-k4b classroom revealed five (5) dolls made of material, doll clothes and a counting game made of felt that was accessible to the children. In accordance with the standards established in 922 KAR 2:410e, bedding (blankets, sheets, pillows, sleeping bags) shall be: (a) Able to be washed; (b) Separated and stored in individual labeled bins without touching another child's bedding; and (c) Washed, at least at the end of each week. Observation of the pre-k3, pre-k4a and pre-k4b classrooms revealed children's sheets and blankets were stored on top of cots. Therefore, the children's bedding was not stored in a labeled individual bin.
