General: Based on review of documentation, the surveyor found no documentation of a Fire Marshal report. During interview, staff-in-charge stated that the Fire Marshal had visited the child-care center; however, they did not provide her with any documentation to verify the visit.

225 - Licensee Responsibility

- (1) A licensee shall:
- (a) Be responsible for the operation of the child-care center pursuant to this administrative regulation, 922 KAR 2:120, and 922 KAR 2:280; and
- (b) Protect and assure the health, safety, and comfort of each child.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the surveyor found the following:

- 1. The surveyor observed a staff person to take over supervising five (5) children in the Preschool/School Age Classroom during nap time. The surveyor observed the staff person to sit in a chair in front of the open entry way of the classroom to supervise the children. The surveyor observed one (1) child asleep on a cot that was positioned back in an open closet. The child's head/face was observed to be out of view due to the positioning of the cot; therefore, the health, safety and comfort of the child was compromised. Through interview with staff, the surveyor learned that the child was approximately two-years-old.
- 2. The surveyor observed a child asleep on a cot that was positioned back in an open closet in the Preschool/School Age Classroom. The surveyor observed approximately seven (7) cots that were standing upright placed beside the child's cot. The cots did not appear to be secure; therefore, the health, safety and comfort of the child was compromised. Through interview with staff, the surveyor learned that the child was approximately two-years-old.
- 3. One (1) bottle of Anti-Bacterial Liquid Soap was observed to be placed on the sink in the Preschool/School Age Classroom that read, "Keep Out of the Reach of Children," on the label; therefore, the health, safety and comfort of the children was compromised.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, the surveyor found that a staff's (DOH: 06/06/22) file did not contain documentation of a current TB skin test or a statement from a health professional stating that the adult was free from active tuberculosis. During interview, staff-in-charge stated that the staff person has had a TB skin test; however, the staff person was waiting on the test to be read.

General: Based on review of documentation, the surveyor found that a child's (DOE: 12/25/19) file contained an immunization certificate that was no longer current as of 10/01/22.

- 2. Retained on file on the first day the child attends the child-care center; and

- b. Contact information to enable a person in charge to contact the child's:
- (i) Parent at the parent's home or place of employment;

General: Based on review of documentation, the surveyor found that the following children's (DOE: 12/25/19 and 12/25/19) files did not contain a contact telephone number for the child's preferred hospital.
