General: Based on Review of Documentation, it was found through a review of nineteen (19) staff files that five (5) staff files did not contain the fifteen (15) hours of cabibet-approved early care and education training. The dates of hire for the staff were, 11/17/2015, 10/20/2015, 04/09/2015, 01/11/2017 and 04/01/2016. A review of ECE-TRIS confirmed this. It was also found through a review of nineteen (19) staff files that three (3) staff files did not have documentation of pediatric abusive head trauma training. The dates of hire for the staff were, 11/02/2016, 07/18/2011 and 01/27/2003. A review of ECE-TRIS confirmed this.
