General: Based on observation and interview, three (3) brown stains were on the ceiling in the lunch area. A small area of the ceiling had peeling plaster that hung down in the lunch area. Interview determined the ceiling leaked in the lunch area.

There was a brown stain in the boys' restroom. Interview determined the ceiling leaked but the leak was fixed.

There were three (3) large brown stains in the school-age room. Interview determined the ceiling leaked but the leak was fixed.
