922 KAR 2:280. Section 3. Implementation and Enforcement.

- (1) A person who is a child care staff member prior to January 1, 2018, shall submit to and complete background checks in accordance with this administrative regulation no later than September 30, 2018.
- (2) A child care staff member hired on or after April 1, 2018, shall:
- (a) Have completed the background checks required in accordance with this administrative regulation and been found to have no disqualifying offense prior to becoming a child care staff member; or
- (b)1. Have submitted to the background checks required in accordance with this administrative regulation;
- 2. Not be left unsupervised with a child in care pending the completion of the background checks in accordance with this administrative regulation: and
- 3. Be dismissed or relocated from the residence if the person is found to have a disqualifying background check result.

Findings:

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, three (3) caregivers hired 06/16/2020, two (2) caregivers hired 06/08/2020, a caregiver hired 08/24/2020, a caregiver hired 07/01/2020, a caregiver hired 05/27/2020, a caregiver hired 05/18/2020, and a caregiver hired 03/07/2020, did not have a background check in the National Background Check Portal (NBCP).

922 KAR 2:120. Section 2. Child Care Services.

(3)(a) Each center shall maintain a child-care program that assures each child will be:

- 1. Provided with adequate supervision at all times by a qualified staff person who ensures the child is:
- a. Within scope of vision and range of voice; or
- b. For a school-age child, within scope of vision or range of voice;

Findings:

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, three (3) caregivers supervised five (5) to ten (10) school age children alone for approximately four (4) hours a day, three (3) days a week beginning 06/15/2020. In addition, three (3) caregivers supervised up to ten (10) school age children alone for five (5) hours a day, five (5) days a week. Each caregiver was under the age of eighteen and was not under direct supervision of a qualified caregiver, therefore, adequate supervision was not provided.

- (10) The minimum number of adult workers in a child-care center shall be sufficient to ensure that:
- (a) Minimum staff-to-child ratios in accordance with 922 KAR 2:120 are followed;
- (b) Each staff person under eighteen (18) years of age and each student trainee are under the direct supervision of a qualified staff person who meets the requirements of this section; and
- (c) Unless providing care with a qualified staff person, a person under the age of eighteen (18) shall not be counted as staff for the staff-to-child ratio.

Findings:

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, three (3) caregivers supervised five (5) to ten (10) school age children alone for approximately four (4) hours a day, three (3) days a week beginning 06/15/2020. In addition, three (3) caregivers supervised up to ten (10) school age children alone for five (5) hours a day, five (5) days a week. Each caregiver was under the age of eighteen and was not under direct supervision of a qualified caregiver, therefore, staff/child ratios were not maintained.

General: Based on interview, the director's employment ended on 08/18/20, and the licensee did not notify the cabinet within a week.

- (1) A director shall:
- (n) Assure that a person acting as a caregiver of a child in care shall not be left alone with a child, if the licensee has not received the results of the background checks as described in 922 KAR 2:280;

Findings:

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, two (2) caregivers hired 06/16/2020, and 07/01/2020, were left alone and supervised five (5) to ten (10) school age children for approximately four (4) hours a day, three (3) days a week beginning 06/15/2020. A caregiver hired 03/07/2020, a caregiver 05/18/19, and a caregiver 06/08/2020, were left alone and supervised up to ten (10) school age children for five (5) hours a day, five (5) days a week. In addition, a caregiver hired 08/24/2020, a caregiver hired 08/24/2020 and a caregiver hired 05/27/2020, were left alone and supervised up to ten (10) preschool to school age children for approximately four (4) hours a day, three (3) to five (5) days a week. Processed and approved background checks were not on file prior to the caregivers being left alone with children.

Due to the current declared public health emergency caused by the Novel Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19), licensed child care centers must operate under Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and public health guidelines, as mandated by 922 KAR 2:400E, to prevent the spread of COVID-19.

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the center failed to assure new staff shall undergo name-based background checks in accordance with 922 KAR 2:280 and shall not be left alone with children until fingerprint-based background checks are able to conducted, in accordance with 922 KAR 2:400E Section 9(5). Two (2) caregivers hired 06/16/2020, and 07/01/2020, were left alone and supervised five (5) to ten (10) school age children for approximately four (4) hours a day, three (3) days a week beginning 06/15/2020. A caregiver hired 03/07/2020, a caregiver 05/18/19, and a caregiver 06/08/2020, were left alone and supervised up to ten (10) school age children for five (5) hours a day, five (5) days a week. In addition, a caregiver hired 08/24/2020, a caregiver hired 08/21/20, a caregiver hired 06/16/2020, a caregiver hired 06/08/2020 and a caregiver hired 05/27/2020, were left alone and supervised up to ten (10) preschool to school age children for approximately four (4) hours a day, three (3) to five (5) days a week. Processed and approved background checks were not on file prior to the caregivers being left alone with children.
