General: Based on review of documentation and interview, a caregiver hired on 09/24/2020, did not have education verification on file.

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, a staff member hired 05/13/2017, did not have documentation of completing one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved Pediatric Abusive Head Trauma Training. A staff member hired 08/31/2020, did not have documentation of completing six (6) hours of orientation training within the first three (3) months of employment.

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, the name of the person who administered Guanfacine on 10/26/2020, 10/28/2020, 11/02/2020, and 11/05/2020 was not documented on the medication sheet. The name of the person who administered Adderall on12/16/2020 was not documented on the medication sheet. The medication sheet contained the child's name, date and parent signatures but did not include the name of the medication, the amount and time of the dosage on 10/19/2020, 10/20/2020, 10/21/2020, 10/22/2020, 11/10/2020, 11/10/2020, 11/11/2020, 11/11/2020, 11/17/2020, 11/19/2020, 11/19/2020. Interview determined the infants' caregiver did not recall the name of the medication given but stated the medication was administered to the child.
