Findings:

General: Based on observation, staff failed to assist a three year old child with personal care and cleanliness. A staff member sent a three year old child to the restroom to change her own soiled pull-up training pants. The child had difficulty and requested assistance.

- (i) Parent at the parent's home or place of employment;

(ii) Family physician; and

(iii) Preferred hospital;

c. The name of each person who is designated in writing to pick-up the child;

- d. The child's general health status and medical history including, if applicable:
- (i) Allergies;

(ii) Restriction on the child's participation in activities with specific instructions from the child's parent or health professional; and

- (iii) Permission from the parent for third-party professional services in the child-care center;
- e. The name and phone number of each person to be contacted in an emergency situation involving or impacting the child;
- f. Authorization by the parent for the child-care center to seek emergency medical care for the child in the parent's absence;
