#### 1265 - Emergency Regulation

#### 922 KAR 2:415E. Emergency Regulation.

Due to the current declared public health emergency caused by the Novel Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19), licensed child care centers must operate under Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and public health guidelines, as mandated by 922 KAR 2:415E, to prevent the spread of COVID-19.

#### Findings:

General: Based on observation, the center failed to assure compliance to 922KAR2:415E. Three (3) stuffed body baby dolls were in the turquoise preschool room. A large stuffed doll hung partially out of a bag on a hook outside of the gray preschool room. A small blue bear was on a shelf near the mounted television in the green preschool room. Two (2) caregivers both hired on 12/1/20, did not have a name-based child abuse/neglect check and a criminal records check on file. A caregiver hired on 12/1/20, did not completed the mandatory training.
