1. A statement from a health professional that the individual is free of active tuberculosis; or

2. A copy of negative tuberculin results.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, this regulatory requirement was not met. The following was found:

1. One staff file (hire date: 8/16/08) contained results of a negative T.B. test that is no longer current. The test was dated 4/24/19, which exceeds the two year time frame.

2. One staff person (hire date: 3/1/22) had TB documentation in her file; however, the documentation did not contain a name or a date. Therefore, the surveyor was unable to determine when the TB test was performed or whom it belonged to.

General: Based on review of documentation and the Training Records Information System (TRIS), one staff person (hire date: 8/16/08) did not complete the required 15 hours of cabinet-approved training between 7/1/2020 and 6/30/21.

General: Based on observation, this regulatory requirement was not met. Two sections of the metal wire fencing on the playground was found in disrepair. The top portion of the fence was smashed downwards and a portion was no longer attached to the wooden support post. The surveyor observed wires on the fence that were broken and contained sharp edges. The surveyor also observed a rusty nail protruding out of the wooden fence post. These items were accessible to the children.
