350 - Program of Activities Followed Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 2. Child Care Services.

(4) The child-care center shall provide a daily planned program:

- (a) Posted in writing in a conspicuous location with each age group and followed;**
- (b) Of activities that are individualized and developmentally appropriate for each child served;**
- (c) That provides experience to promote the individual child's physical, emotional, social, and intellectual growth and well-being; and**
- (d) That offers a variety of creative activities including the following:**
 - 1. Art;**
 - 2. Music;**
 - 3. Dramatic play;**
 - 4. Stories and books;**
 - 5. Science;**
 - 6. Block building;**
 - 7. Tactile activity;**
 - 8. Culture;**
 - 9. Indoor or outdoor play in which a child makes use of both small and large muscles;**
 - 10. A balance of active and quiet play, including group and individual activity;**
 - 11. An opportunity for a child to:**
 - a. Have some free choice of activities;**
 - b. If desired, play apart from the group at times;**

Findings:

General: Based on Observation and Interview, the center failed to comply with regulatory programming requirements. In the One-Year-Old Room, there was an inadequate supply of dramatic play materials available for use by the toddlers in the room. The owner acknowledged she was in the process of addressing the issue.

(6) Exclusive of the kitchen, bathroom, hallway, and storage area, there shall be a minimum of thirty-five (35) square feet of space per child.

Findings:

General: Based on Observation, Interview, and Review of Documentation, the child care center failed to maintain the premises in accordance with regulations. The One-Year-Old Room is a large room divided into two (2) distinct rooms by a half-wall containing a gate/door, thereby dividing the room into a front and back section. On 3/9/17, there were twelve (12) one-year-olds in the back section of the room. Interviews confirmed that staff members regularly care for twelve (12) one-year-olds in the back section of the room. Room measurements taken by surveyor on 3/9/17 revealed the back section of the room allows for only ten (10) children based on the thirty-five (35) square feet of space per child regulatory requirement. The owners acknowledged the back section of the room allows for only ten (10) children and they acknowledged that twelve (12) children were routinely cared for in the back section of the room.
