- 3. Heated in a microwave

## Findings:

General: Based on Observation, and interview the child care center failed to maintain food service in accordance with regulatory requirements. Observation of the Infant Classroom revealed two (2) children allowed to feed themselves as one (1) rested on a "Boppy" pillow and the other in a "Bouncy" seat. Interview with staff revealed the two (2) children observed were six (6) and seven (7) months in age.

(a) A current immunization certificate for each child in care within thirty (30) days of the child's enrollment, unless an attending physician or the child's parent objects to the immunization of the child pursuant to KRS 214.036;

### Findings:

General: Based on Review of Documentation, the child care center failed to maintain children's records in accordance with regulatory requirements. Upon request, the child care center failed to provide documented evidence of a current immunization certificate for children with a date of enrollment 11/07/16 and 12/12/16.

- (1) A child-care center shall maintain:
- (b) A written record for each child:
  - 1. Completed and signed by the child's parent;
  - 2. Retained on file on the first day the child attends the child-care center; and
- 3. To contain:
- a. Identifying information about the child, which includes, at minimum, the child's name, address, and date of birth;
- b. Contact information to enable a person in charge to contact the child's:
- (i) Parent at the parent's home or place of employment;
- (ii) Family physician; and
- (iii) Preferred hospital;
- c. The name of each person who is designated in writing to pick-up the child;
- d. The child's general health status and medical history including, if applicable:
- (i) Allergies;
- (ii) Restriction on the child's participation in activities with specific instructions from the child's parent or health professional; and
- (iii) Permission from the parent for third-party professional services in the child-care center;
- e. The name and phone number of each person to be contacted in an emergency situation involving or impacting the child;
- f. Authorization by the parent for the child-care center to seek emergency medical care for the child in the parent's absence;

#### Findings:

General: Based on Review of Documentation, the child care center failed to maintain children's records in accordance with regulatory requirements. Upon request, the child care center failed to maintain and provide written enrollment record for a child with an unknown enrollment date.

- (c) Daily attendance records documenting the arrival and departure time of each child, including records that are required in accordance with 922 KAR 2:160, Section 13, if a child receives services from the child-care center through the Child Care Assistance Program;

## Findings:

General: Based on Observation and review of documentation, the child care center failed to maintain written documentation in accordance with regulatory requirements. Observation of the child care center revealed eighty-four (84) children in attendance. However, review of the child care center's Attendance Record revealed seventy (70) children signed in to care.
