Findings:

General: Based on observation and review of documentation, the family child care home failed to maintain children's records in accordance with regulations. A review of children's files revealed that a file for a child with an enrollment date of 5/30/17 did not include a preferred medical doctor or a preferred hospital.

A review of records revealed that on the date of survey, there was no proof that a written evacuation plan was submitted to local emergency management officials.

Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, the family child care home provider failed to post documentation in accordance with regulations. Each statement of deficiency issued by the cabinet during the current licensure year and each plan of correction submitted by the child care center to the cabinet during the current licensure year were not posted in a conspicuous place and made available for public inspection at the time of survey. In additon, the family child care provider disclosed that the plan of correction was not available on the date of survey.
