- (16) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:
- (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation completed within the first three (3) months of employment in a child-care program;
- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment in a child care program, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and
- (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training completed between July 1 and the following June 30 of each subsequent year of employment in a child care program, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.
- (17) A staff person's compliance with training requirements of this section shall be verified through the cabinet-designated database maintained pursuant to 922 KAR 2:240.

Findings:

435 - Training

General: Based on review of documentation and the Training Records Information System (TRIS), all three staff (hire dates: 7/1/01, 10/5/16, and 7/1/04) did not complete the required 15 hours of cabinet-approved training hours between 7/1/2020 and 6/30/21.

605 - Building Requirements Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 4. Premises Requirements.

- (5) The building shall be constructed to ensure the:
- (a) Building is:
- 1. Dry;
- 2. Ventilated; and
- 3. Well lit, including clean light fixtures that are:
- a. In good repair in all areas; and
- b. Shielded or have shatter-proof bulbs installed; and
- (b) Following are protected:
- 1. Windows;
- 2. Doors;
- 3. Stoves:
- 4. Heaters;

- 6. Pipes; and
- 7. Stairs.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, this regulatory requirement was not met. During a tour of the facility, the surveyor observed the ceiling light positioned over a stack of cots that was dim and blinked constantly during the inspection.

1095 - Milk Requirements Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 9. Food and Drink Requirements for All Child-Care Centers.

- (3) A serving of milk shall consist of:
- (a) Breast milk or iron-fortified formula for a child:
- 1. Age birth to twelve (12) months; or
- 2. Beyond twelve (12) months of age as documented by the parent or the child's physician;
- (b) Pasteurized unflavored whole milk for children ages twelve (12) months to twenty-four (24) months; or
- (c) Pasteurized unflavored low fat one (1) percent or fat-free skim milk for children ages twenty-four (24) months to school-age.

Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, this regulatory requirement was not met. During an inspection of the refrigerator used to store food and drinks for the children, the surveyor only found whole milk and 2% available to serve to the children. Nine children in care were identified as being two-years-old and older. The staff person in charge acknowledged the finding and stated that she was not aware of this regulatory requirement.

1245 - Immunization Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:090. Section 9. Records.

- (1) A child-care center shall maintain:
- (a) A current immunization certificate for each child in care within thirty (30) days of the child's enrollment, unless an attending physician or the child's parent objects to the immunization of the child pursuant to KRS 214.036;

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, one child had an immunization certificate on file that was no longer current as of 9/15/21.

1250 - Enrollment Information Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:090. Section 9. Records.

- (1) A child-care center shall maintain:
- (b) A written record for each child:
- 1. Completed and signed by the child's parent;
- 2. Retained on file on the first day the child attends the child-care center; and
- 3. To contain:
- a. Identifying information about the child, which includes, at a minimum, the child's name, address, and date of birth;
- b. Contact information to enable a person in charge to contact the child's:
- (i) Parent at the parent's home or place of employment;
- (ii) Family physician; and
- (iii) Preferred hospital;
- c. The name of each person who is designated in writing to pick-up the child;
- d. The child's general health status and medical history including, if applicable:
- (i) Allergies;
- (ii) Restriction on the child's participation in activities with specific instructions from the child's parent or health professional; and
- (iii) Permission from the parent for third-party professional services in the child-care center;
- e. The name and phone number of each person to be contacted in an emergency involving or impacting the child;
- f. Authorization by the parent for the child-care center to seek emergency medical care for the child in the parent's absence;

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, observation, and interview, this regulatory requirement was not met. One child present had a folder on file for the surveyor to review; however, a review of the contents inside the folder found that it contained an enrollment form and information about a different child in care. The staff person in charge acknowledged the finding and stated that the form was for the child's younger brother. The staff person in charge was not able to locate enrollment documentation for the child in question during the visit; therefore, none of the required information had been obtained.

Written Documentation Not In Compliance

1260 - Evacuation Plan Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:090. Section 5. Evacuation Plan.

(1) A licensed child-care center shall have a written evacuation plan in the event of a fire, natural disaster, or other threatening situation that may pose a health or safety hazard for a child in care in accordance with KRS 199.895 and 42 U.S.C. 9858c(c)(2)(U).

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, this regulatory requirement was not met. The emergency preparedness plan on file had not been updated since 9/9/19.

1285 - Earthquake/Tornado/Fire Drills

922 KAR 2:090. Section 9. Records.

- (1) A child-care center shall maintain:
- (h) A written record of quarterly practiced earthquake drills and tornado drills detailing the date, time, and children who participated in accordance with 922 KAR 2:120, Section 3;
- (i) A written record of practiced fire drills conducted monthly detailing the date, time, and children who participated in accordance with 922 KAR 2:120, Section 3;

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, this regulatory requirement was not met. The surveyor reviewed the emergency drill log during the visit and found that fire, earthquake and tornado drills were practiced on the same day, at the same time (4/4/21 at 10:30AM, 5/16/21 at 4:15PM, 6/22/21 at 11:00AM, 7/28/21 at 9:50AM, 8/10/21 at 10:15AM and 9/28/21 at 11:00AM); therefore, they were all done together, not separate.
