Findings:

General: Based on Review of Documentation, a cook hired on 9/28/15, did not have a criminal records check on file. A caregiver hired 7/1/16, did not have an out of state criminal records check from the state of Tennessee.

Findings:

General: Based on Review of Documentation, a caregiver hired on 8/9/16, had TB documentation that did not indicate the results of the test. Also, a cook hired on 9/28/15, did not have TB documentation on file.

340 - Training Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:110. Section 5. Staff Requirements.

- (14) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:
- (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;
- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1 $\frac{1}{2}$) hours of pediatric abusive head trauma training; and

General: Based on Review of Documentation, a caregiver hired on 10/5/15, lacked five and a half (5 1/2) hours of training and a caregiver hired on 9/23/13, lacked thirteen (13) hours of training.

General: Based on Observation, three (3) light fixtures had dead bugs in the hallway of the head start classrooms; four (4) light fixtures had dead bugs in the hallway outside of the infants' and one (1) year olds' rooms, and five (5) light fixtures had dead bugs in the main hallway of the center.

Findings:

General: Based on Observation, a tank lid extended two (2) inches out on both sides of the toilet tank in a restroom located between the infants' room and one (1) year olds' room.

General: Based on Observation, a crib mattress had a loose fitted sheet. The crib was near the window in the infants' room. Also, a fitted crib sheet had a five inch tear. The crib sheet was in use in the infants' room.

General: Based on Observation, bottom cover plate of a dishwasher was off and exposed wiring in a kitchenette between the infants' room and one (1) year olds' room. Interview determined the dishwasher had been in use. Also, a cream colored highchair with blue and white stripes was missing the safety straps in the infants' room.

General: Based on Review of Documentation, there was no documentation of conducted fire drills during the months of January through July 2016. Interview determined it was not certain if fire drills were conducted.
